By June 2023, Barnwell School District 45 will increase the number of students in grades 3-8 approaching, meeting, and exceeding grade level proficiency in ELA and math as measured by SC Ready, the state summative assessment. Provide Summer Programs 4K- Grade 8 including CERDEP Summer Extension along with the following: BPS Summer Camp for grades 1-2 and Summer Reading Camp for grade 3 BES Summer Camp for grades 4-6 GBMS Summer Camp for grades 7-8 Employ interventionists to support students in ELA in kindergartengrade 3, in ELA and math in grades 4-6, and in math in grades 7-8. Provide before and after school tutoring for students not meeting performance expectations in core classes for students in grades 7-8 beginning in January of 2023.
By June 2023, Barnwell School District 45 will increase the number of students earning a National Career Readiness Silver or Higher Certificate overall as well as in the areas of Applied Math, Graphic Literacy, and Workplace Documents to align to state performance averages. Provide credit recovery for students in grades 9-12. Provide before and after school tutoring for students not meeting performance expectations in core classes for students in grades 9-12 beginning in January of 2023. Provide a summer enrichment program with STEAM focus for students in grades 9-12.

Provide teachers with professional learning opportunities on multiple instructional strategies with a focus on meeting and supporting unique learner needs. Employ a behavior coach to support students who are academically and behaviorally at-risk. Expand the Grade 8 STAR Academy Program to include high school freshmen to support students identified as not being on track to graduate in four years because of at-risk factors. Implement a structured mentor plan so each student is well known by at least one adult advocate who supports that student's educational experience.
